ST PETER'S COMMUNITY, GAYAGANGA

The entire community (Priests, Brothers, and Scholastics) went out to the villages several days to bless the houses after Easter. After many days of instruction, 88 children received First Holy Communion on 21 April. Now about 80 children are



being instructed to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation on 1 May by **Rt Rev. Archbishop Vincent Aind**. Marriages of 18 couples were rectified after due instructions. The feast of patron saint of Gayaganga mission, St Peter Canisius, was celebrated on 21 April. As part of preparation a triduum was organized from 18-20 April and the preachers were **Fr Nabor Dungdung, Fr Roshan Minj** and **Fr Binod Kerketta.** On 1 April, the community bade farewell to **Fr Timothy Tirkey**, who assisted the Parish priest for the past ten months.

On 4 April, Fr Cherian Maliekal, joined other consultors to go to Kathmandu for a joint consult. Sch. Bipin Tirkey arrived from DNC, Pune for his summer holidays. He was here for two weeks. He generously offered his services in the parish and community. On 22 April, Sch. Ramhorchan Angelus joined the community as new regent. Fr Nabor, Fr Simon Kerketta and Br Robert Lakra were assigned to conduct the first and second phases of Lok Sabha elections. It was a humbling experience, they said, as they had to attend training workshops, manage the polling procedure with colleagues who were strangers, spend night with minimum facilities, etc. The Primary and High school schools in the campus have been shut indefinitely due to the ongoing heat wave and parliamentary elections. During the shutdown period about 50 under-14 boys of the school are undergoing intense football-training, supervised by special coaches. The school-office remains open during the day with the HM and the office staff in attendance.

St Peter's primary school lost Liyan Kujur, a pre-KG student from Gungaram Tea Estate. He was pillion riding on a bicycle with his elder brother. A tractor ferrying sand illegally mowed down the boys. Liyan died on the spot and his brother lost one leg. There was a big protest by the locals. A community Faith sharing session was arranged on 10 April in Loyola Niwas Community, Uttar Salbari. Each member was invited to share about his vocation, God experiences and personal challenges encountered during his family days, pre-novitiate and other years of formation, post ordination days and life as a Jesuit in the missions. Fr Cherian Maliekal, moderated the technique exercise using the of Spiritual Conversation. All felt that it was an intense sharing. Some of them were moved to tears as they narrated their faith journey. They returned to community with feelings of joy, gratitude, contentment and hopefulness.
