#### From the Provincial's Desk

The Holy Week reminds us of the need to use three important tools in life: (i) Consciousness Examen, (ii) Discernment of Spirits and (iii) Ignatian Contemplation. When we are dealing with crisis, suffering, fear, anxiety, worry, death and injustice, God asks us to look for Him amid the events that occur. The prayer called "Consciousness Examen" that we do at the end of every day helps us to see where God is. Often in difficult times, we focus only on the difficulties and not where God might be. We are so caught up in the day-to-day events, and we miss where God is speaking to us. The Consciousness Examen gives one time to notice where God is active during the day, to be able to look back and see where God has been beneficial to overcome the difficulties and challenges.



The Holy Week also invites us to make good decisions every day. This requires filtering of our thoughts or instances that give good or bad feelings in the light of the passion and death of Jesus. Anything that gives someone more hope, confidence, courage, and a sense of upliftment comes from God. Anything that says that nothing can change will lead us to despair. That is not coming from God. Finally, the Holy Week also invites us to use our imagination to place ourselves within a scripture scene or to imagine speaking with God. The invitation is to trust that Jesus will calm the waves in our lives by seeing how He has conquered difficulties. The fruit of such contemplation is our own resurrection and a new beginning.

# ST JOSEPH'S SCHOOL, NORTH POINT, DARJEELING

In-person classes for the day-scholars of classes IX, X and XII are held regularly. The live telecast of the rest of the classes is on as well for the students at home. The boarders of classes IX, X and XII are reporting to the school on different weeks with the consent letters of their parents, along with negative COVID test reports. Each batch is kept in quarantine for a week. The ICSE and ISC examinees arrived on 13 March. The remedial classes and mock tests are arranged for the ICSE and ISC examinees to supplement their exam preparations. On 13 March an orientation was held for



class XII students by the school staff, which was well appreciated by the students.

The school celebrated the feast of the school patron Saint Joseph on

18 March with a Mass for the students and staff of the school, followed by lunch. **Fr Rector** was the main celebrant. We have resumed the first Friday Masses for the students and the staff at the school. On 20 March, a highly acclaimed orientation was given to the teaching staff of the school by **Fr Rector** on '**POCSO**' and '**Legal Advisory**'. A meeting with the day-scholar parents of class VIII, IX, X & XII was held on the 27<sup>th</sup>. On the same day an entrance test was conducted for the new class XI.

The dispersed community members had a recollection by **Fr K.J. Joseph** on 18 March followed by a combined birthday celebrations of **Fr Leo**, **Schs. Pankaj** and **Amit. Fr Sunny Jacob** spent two days at the community prior to his NEP seminars to the staff of different schools in Darjeeling. The scholastics from the community are going to Kainjalia and Singla for Easter ministry for a week. **Fr K.J. Joseph** has gone home to visit his elder sister who is suffering from cancer. At Lepcha Busty, there was a day-long retreat for the Parishioners, preached by **Fr Abraham.** On 26 the Parishioners of Lepcha Busty went on a walking pilgrimage to Singla Church.

### **WERY NIWAS, KURSEONG**

St Paul's Parish organized a Novena of Grace to St. Francis Xavier from 4<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup>March. Priests and Nuns of different congregations and Diocese were invited to give talks. conducted a one-day seminar for young couples. 24 couples participated. On 20th a day-long Charismatic retreat was held in the parish organized by the Charismatic group of the parish. **Br. Peter Jong** heard confessions and gave communion to the sick and aged who are unable to come to the parish for Mass. From 26th to 27th recollection for Crusvir and Christeen was organized in Woodcot. **Sr. Barbara Rudum**, IBVM and team conducted the program.

St. Alphonsus School is holding normal classes for classes 9, 10, 11 &12. About 75% of students are attending regularly, although it's not compulsory for them. On 8<sup>th</sup> March, the school prefects had a meeting to assess the ongoing classes and discipline of students. On 12<sup>th</sup> a staff meeting was held. In order to improve the teaching-learning process, the staff agreed unanimously to introduce FLIP learning method and skill based work-education class. **Mr. Nirmal** who retired in December 2019 was given farewell on 31<sup>st</sup> of this month. **Fr. Kevin** attended a webinar for headmasters from 16<sup>th</sup> to 20<sup>th</sup> March conducted by the West Bengal Board of Education.

## JESU ASHRAM, MATIGARA

On 28th February morning, **Fr Julius Kujur**, two nurses and **Sch. David Ekka** rushed to New Jalpaiguri taxi-stand to attend to a man

lying motionless, in a critical condition. He was brought to Jesu Ashram and given medical care. Unfortunately, he died the same night. The ordeal didn't end there, though. When we



informed the local police, they asked us to take his body to the North Bengal Medical College & Hospital (NBMCH) for further action.

In NBMCH we were asked by the Medical officers to get the papers done from the police station! Shocking bureaucracy! An NBMCH doctor examined the body and asked us to go to the morgue for the post-mortem. The stench at the morgue threw us off our feet. Soon we regained our composure and completed the formalities for the man about whom we knew nothing. Except that he made us good Samaritans!

The number of new patients is increasing in Jesu Ashram as we resumed admitting new patients after the lockdown. Recently, a girl child (Sanam Lohar) was brought here with severe burns. Intense care and treatment is given to her. Another child Pravi Munda, suffering from omental hernia, was brought here and was later admitted to Navjeevan Hospital, Gayaganga, for the operation. 43 staff and students of Jesu Ashram, including the Sisters and Jesuits, have been vaccinated in Navjeevan Hospital. The rest will take the jab in April.



Transport support is very important in the healing mission. **SOS India** promptly responded to our request for an ambulance, over a year ago. Alas, three months after booking the vehicle, the order was cancelled by the company because it stopped producing ambulances! Another company was approached. This time due to COVID-19, the company was under lockdown! At last we got the new ambulance, after a year! Thanks to **SOS India** for the continuous support to Jesu Ashram in every way.


